

This year there were a few issues before the Torrance City Council of interest to residents of the Riviera Homeowners Association.

In February, the City Council approved a set of recommendations designed to reduce helicopter noise associated with Torrance Airport. Currently, the designated arrival and departure routes ask pilots cruise at least 600 feet above sea level (after take-off and before landing). Residents of our area are impacted by the helicopter route above Pacific Coast Highway. For this route, the Council asked the FAA to establish higher cruise altitudes: 1400 feet above sea level for departures; and 1200 feet above sea level for arrivals. The Council's request

is currently under review by the FAA. If approved, the new altitudes will be implemented on a six-month trial period. If it goes well, the routes may be made permanent.

In June, the Council approved the City's budget for 2011-2013. The Council had to make some difficult decisions on cuts to balance the City's budget. One of the alternatives involved consolidating the staffs of the El Retiro and Walteria Branch Libraries and reducing hours of operation to 2 days a week at El Retiro and 3 days a week at Walteria. Another alternative involved the possible elimination of the paramedic unit from the fire station at Calle Mayor and PCH. Fortunately, the Council found other ways

to balance its budget, so neither of these alternatives was adopted. In the end, the budget was balanced primarily by eliminating about 20 vacant positions in a variety of departments.

Riviera HOA Presidents submitted comments to the City Council on both of the above issues.

Also of interest, in September, the Council had a lengthy discussion regarding the award of a contract to provide ambulance service for the Fire Department. City staff recommended awarding the contract to McCormick Ambulance. The Council voted to retain Gerber Ambulance, who has had the contract since 1995. So, Gerber will continue to provide the City's ambulance service.





Your Annual Financial To-Do List

Things you can do before and for the New Year.

The end of the year is a good time to review your personal finances. What are your financial, business or life priorities for 2012? Try to specify the goals you want to accomplish. Think about the consistent investing, saving or budgeting methods you could use to realize them. Also, consider these year-end moves.

Consider the tax impact of any 2011 transactions. Did you sell any real property this year - or do you plan to before the year ends? Did you start a business? Are you thinking about exercising a stock option? Could any large commissions or bonuses come your way before the end of the year? Did you sell an investment that was held outside of a tax-deferred account? Any of these moves might have a big impact on your taxes.

Consider Tax Harvesting Strategies. With a volatile market in 2011, you may have capital losses that you can easily recognize to either offset any gains and/or carry forward for future years.

Think about adjusting or timing your income and tax deductions. If you will be in a high tax bracket in 2011 and have the option of postponing a portion of the taxable income you will make until 2012, this decision can bring you some tax savings. You might also consider accelerating payment of deductible expenses if you are close to the line on itemized deductions another way to potentially reduce the April tax burden.

Think about putting more in your 401(k) or 403(b). The IRS hasn't announced the contribution limit for 2012 yet. Given the moderate inflation of late, we might see the annual limit rise to \$17,000 from the present \$16,500, or not. In 2011, you can contribute up to \$16,500 per year to these accounts with a \$5,500 catch-up contribution also allowed if you are age 50 or older. Has your 2011 contribution reached the annual limit? There is still time to put more into your employer-sponsored retirement plan.1

Can you max out your IRA contribution at the start of 2012? We don't yet know if the 2012 contribution limits on traditional and Roth IRAs will rise from 2011 levels. If the IRS leaves limits where they are now, you will be able to contribute up to \$5,000 to your IRA next year if you are age 49 or younger, and

up to \$6,000 if you are age 50 and older.2

Should you convert to a Roth between now and the end of 2012? While you can no longer divide the income from a Roth IRA conversion across two years of federal tax returns, converting a traditional IRA into a Roth before 2013 may make sense for another reason: federal taxes might be higher in 2013. Congress extended the Bush-era tax cuts through the end of 2012; their sunset may not be delayed any further.3

Some MAGI phase-out limits affect Roth IRA contributions. If the phase-out limits aren't adjusted north for 2012, phase-outs will kick in at \$169,000 for joint filers and \$107,000 for single filers. Should your MAGI exceed those limits, you still have a chance to contribute to a traditional IRA in 2012 and then roll those IRA assets over into a Roth.4

Consult a tax or financial professional before you make any IRA moves. You will want see how it may affect your overall financial picture. The tax consequences of a Roth conversion can get sticky if you own multiple traditional IRAs.

If you are retired and older than 70½, don't forget an RMD. Retirees over age 70½ must take Required Minimum Distributions from traditional IRAs and 401(k)s by December 31, 2012. Remember that the IRS penalty for failing to take an RMD equals 50% of the RMD amount.5

If you have turned or will turn 70½ in 2011, you can postpone your first IRA RMD until April 1, 2012. The downside of that is that you will have to take two IRA RMDs next year, both taxable events - you will have to make your 2011 tax year withdrawal by April 1, 2012 and your 2012 tax year withdrawal by December 31, 2012.5

You may wish to make a charitable gift before New Year's Day. Make a charitable contribution this year and you can claim the deduction on your 2011 return.

You could make December the "13th month". Can you make a January mortgage payment in December, or make a lump sum payment on your mortgage balance? If you have a fixedrate mortgage, a lump sum payment can reduce the home loan amount and the total interest paid on the loan by that much more. In a sense, paying down a debt is almost like getting a risk-free return.

Are you marrying next year, or do you know someone who is? The top of 2012 is a good time to review (and possibly change) beneficiaries to your 401(k) or 403(b) account, your IRA, your insurance policy and other assets. You may want to change beneficiaries in your will. It is also wise to take a look at your insurance coverage. If your last name is changing, you will need a new Social Security card. Lastly, assess your debts and the merits of your existing financial plans.

Don't delay – get it done. Talk with a qualified financial or tax professional today, so you can focus on being healthy and wealthy in the New Year.

The Schwegel Family



Chit-Chat with Designers

Chris & Suzy By Sara Balough

We are back again with designers **Chris Fowler** and **Suzy Moore** of Fowler and Moore.

What is the cheapest way to make a big change in your home? Paint, Paint, Paint, Paint and Paint!

What is your favorite brand of paint?

CF: Benjamin Moore – for over 20 years we've been using it

SM: Start with the historical colors in BM – they are tried, tested and very classic. The new deck has more intense colors. Benjamin Moore is local to Southern California and I think their colors just look great in our light.

Are there colors you absolutely avoid?

SM: Color trends come and go – it is not easy when a client clings to a dated color scheme such as the teal and maroon. **CF:** Black on the walls – that's pretty tough to deal with.

When can dark colors be used successfully on the walls?

CF: Dark color creates intimacy and coziness – I like them for powder rooms, libraries and dining rooms. You can break it up with chair rails and wainscoting for larger rooms because a great big room that is too dark is just kind of an elephant in the

SM: Dark colors are necessary in our modern screening rooms - you don't want reflections while watching a film. Wine cellars are fun in a darker color too – it adds to that underground atmosphere.

What finish of paint do you recommend? SM: I love texture for walls. Antiquing, combing, color washing, glazing, pickling or Venetian plaster are all finishes we use to add interest, warmth and patina to a home. **CF:** For the home remodeler, beware of too much sheen. We recommend eggshell finish for most rooms. Bathrooms and kitchens can use a little more gloss to make it easier to wipe clean and semi gloss can be nice on the trim. But a glassy finish

can be dangerous if it isn't handled properly.

Are boy's rooms always primary colors and girl's rooms always pink or purple?

CF: Not at all – I grew up in a room that was bright yellow, orange and white. For my 16th birthday, my Dad installed my own private sink in my room and my mother made a vanity with a skirt. It even had a mirror with those ball lights around it – it was wonderful, very personal and special because they made it just for me. Can you guess what year that was? **SM:** It's not polite to say a ladies age, Chris but it sure sounds like the 60's to me. The reality is, our kids are very susceptible to marketing. Look at Pottery Barn kids or PBTeens and tell me how many options you see that aren't in that color palette? Most kids want what their friends want.

What is the most popular color you are seeing today? **SM:** Sky, grass and ocean colors are BIG trends right now. **CF:** But we are also seeing some gray and tonal palettes especially in contemporaries.



What is your own personal favorite color?

SM & CF: RED! **SM:** ...and warm golds!

What do you call that style that is dark wood floors and white walls?

SM: Booooorrrrrr-ing! Just kidding Chris.

CF: It is a stark, clean look. Sometimes it is used in Spanish homes to hearken back to the period when they used untinted

What is the color men object to most?

CF: Pink, magenta – anything that they view as too feminine... whereas I cannot think of a color that women generally don't

SM: I think the color is green like money – my husband says - "its great Suzy, the question isn't- do I like it, but what is it going to cost me?"

What is the worst color request you ever had?

SM: Oh I've had a few requests to do a room like a man-caveyou know all macho and in their college colors which can sometimes be fine (USC or UCLA) but if you want the Tennessee colors, it's tough.

CF: I once had someone do their whole house in the same colors that a color consultant told them they should wear – you know – I'm a winter so I only wear these colors. Well she wanted her house done like that – but at the end of the day, she said "Please Chris, don't let me do ugly – even if I beg you for it!" I was happy to oblige.







The average sales price in the Hollywood Riviera for the first 10 months of 2011 was \$963,192. Above are 4 examples near that approximate price range. Of course, there were some that sold for more and some that sold for less. The *highest sales price* in 2011 so far was \$2,000,000 (on Paseo de Suenos on the corner of Paseo de la Playa) and the *lowest sales price* was \$520,000 (a short sale on Newton).

So far our average price is down 3.6% year over year — as the first 10 months average price from 2010 was \$999,102. The *number of homes* sold in 2011 is up 11% over last year at this time however - 73 for 2011 vs. 63 homes sold for the first 10 months of 2010. Looking at the big picture, we are 17% off of our high in 2007 when the average price was \$1,152,992 and 82 homes had sold in the first 10 months of 2007.

According to a 'Dataquick' article dated Sept 14, 2011, regional sales are off as many would-be buyers can't find financing and others who want to make a move now are stuck because they owe more than their homes are worth. Financial markets are increasingly choppy, the political outlook is murky, and consumer confidence remains poor. If you can afford to buy, it's a good time with interest rates at historical lows.

Will A Better Plan Work?

Rumor has it the White House is considering a plan for troubled homeowners to refinance their mortgages at lower rates. The idea would be for American homeowners who have lost excessive value in their homes to benefit from the rock bottom mortgage interest rates.

The plan would impact mortgage loans backed by the U.S. Government and would extend the offer to homeowners who don't have two critical characteristics that most refinancing candidates should have: good credit and decent equity in their homes.

The White House previously had a plan to help homeowners called the Home Affordable Mortgage Program (HAMP.) This initiative was very underwhelming and actually a certified disaster. Most people who attempted to take advantage of the HAMP programs found

themselves either stuck in trial loan modifications or the borrowers were denied permanent modifications. Fewer than 5% of borrowers in the Fresno & Los Angeles Metropolitan Statistical Areas received loan modifications that included a reduction in principal. Finally, almost half of borrowers who requested loan modifications under this program never made it to the trial stage.

If the White House announces the new plan by the end of the year, this could finally be the break many struggling homeowners are looking for. It will be everything HAMP wasn't.

Roasted Rosemary Turkey

Ingredients

34 cup olive oil

3 tablespoons minced garlic

2 tablespoons chopped fresh rosemary

1 tablespoon chopped fresh basil

1 tablespoon Italian seasoning

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

Salt to taste

1 (12 pound) whole turkey

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. In a small bowl, mix olive oil, garlic, rosemary, basil, Italian seasoning, pepper & salt. Set aside. Wash the turkey inside and out; pat dry. Loosen the skin from the breast. This is done by slowly working your fingers between the breast & the skin. Work it loose to the end of the drumstick, being careful not to tear the skin. Using your hand, spread generous amounts of the rosemary mixture under the breast skin, down to the thigh & leg. Rub the remainder over the outside of the breast. Use toothpicks to seal skin over any exposed breast meat. Place the turkey on a rack in a roasting pan. Add about 1/4" of water to the bottom of the pan. Roast in preheated oven for 3-4 hours or until the internal temperature is 180 degrees F. Cool & carve!

Q: How do I know if I have "Tennis Elbow" or "Golfer's Elbow"?

A: Tennis Elbow is the layman's term for an overuse injury to the "outside" part of the elbow. The tendons that connect the forearm muscles called the extensors to the

elbow can become inflamed and painful due to excessive activity such as gripping, turning a screwdriver or hitting tennis balls. If the pain is on the inside of the elbow, this is generally referred to as "Golfer's" elbow and is due to overuse of the tendons that attach the flexor muscles to the elbow.

As with any type of tendonitis, the initial goal is decreasing inflammation. The most common treatment approach includes avoiding the aggravating activity, taking non-steroidal anti-inflammatories, icing and in some cases physical therapy. Physical therapy might include soft tissue mobilization, stretching and eventual strengthening of the involved muscles. Occa-

sionally, people have success by using a brace near the elbow joint, which provides compression and is thought to transfer the forces away from the joint toward the forearm.

In more severe or chronic cases, your orthopedist may inject cortisone or perform surgery, although this is usually avoidable. When surgery is appropriate, your orthopedist may debride the area of torn, frayed tissue, repair a tear or roughen the bone surface to increase blood flow and subsequently improve healing.

If you have this condition, it is a good idea to seek treatment from your physician and possibly a physical therapist, as it is much more difficult to resolve in long standing cases. Additionally, these symptoms could potentially come from other orthopedic conditions that would require a thorough evaluation to determine if, indeed, the problem is truly "tennis" or "golfer's" elbow.


