#### Rainfall in the Riviera 1995/1996

The rainfall for Hollywood Riviera was collected from 1 July 1995 to 30 June 1996.

The results of the data show that this rainfall year was below average for our area. The total rainfall was only 9.7 inches compared to a normal rainfall of 14 inches. It rained once in July, as one Homeowner reminded me because it provided for an unusual wedding present. The next rain wasn't until November (0.1 in.). As is typical for Southern California, the majority of rain fell from December to March. The monthly totals were 1.6, 2.3, 4.0, and 1.3in., respectively. The end of January and February were when we gained the greatest

amounts with 31 January 1996 having the largest single rainfall of 1.7 inches.







## Safe Driving In The Riviera

We get a lot of calls regarding the narrow streets and how best to treat two-way traffic when there are parked cars on one side of the street that restrict the ability of the traffic to pass side-by-side. According to the state code, vehicles shall not cross over the center

line of the street into oncoming traffic. Therefore the vehicle traveling on the side of the street of the parked vehicles should defer right of way to the vehicle traveling on the side of the street with no parking to ensure safe passage of both.

# DEDICATION OF TORRANCE LIBRARY

The Torrance City Council unanimously approved the designation of the Civic Center Library as the Kay Geissert Torrance Library. Mayor Dee Hardison noted the many contributions that long-time community leader, Katy Geissert, has made, particularly her role in the development of the Torrance library system.

In the late sixties Katy led a bond campaign to finance the acquisition of necessary books and construction of buildings for the Torrance library. The bond was passed in April 1967 and Torrance left the Los Angeles County library system the following year. In 1971 the Civic Center Library was dedicated.
