Benson continues to monitor, scribe and update meeting minutes and board publications. Jim Gates found a new convenient location for regular board meetings.



# What's Up In the Neighborhood:



### Planning Department

The following locations inside the Hollywood Riviera and/or Hillside Overlay District are scheduled for Public Hearings or they have recently been held:

- 411 Camino de Encanto. City Council denial of appeal and approval of minor exemption to allow for the installation of a 3' x 4' window.
- 445 Paseo de la Playa. Planning Commission approval of a waiver for yard setbacks.
- 214 Calle de Arboles. Planning Commission approval of a precise plan for first and second story additions.
- 121 Paseo de Granada. Planning Commission approval of a precise plan for a one-story addition over an existing garage.

Additionally, the Planning Commission will consider modifications to citywide review procedures for development projects which are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

#### Underground Utilities Committee

The UUC is currently looking for RHA members to volunteer their time and energy.

## Newton Street Chokers to be removed

Last November, following City Council approval, traffic chokers were placed on Newton Street between Calle Mayor and Nancy Lee Lane to help reduce vehicular speed and cut-through traffic along Newton. Traffic chokers are areas marked off on each side of the road to create a narrow path that will encourage drivers to reduce speed.

Upon implementation, complains from Newton Street residents challenged the effectiveness of these chokers. Complaints included: the temporary chokers are aesthetically displeasing; take up existing parking spaces; cause heavier traffic during school drop-off/pick-up; make it more difficult for children/families to cross Newton.

In addition, new stop signs on Newton at Harlee and Highgrove were installed. Following the April speed survey taken by the City Planning Departmentt he Traffic Commission voted to accept the recommendation to remove the temporary chokers. No City Council review of this recommendation for removal of temporary traffic calming measures is necessary.



### Y2K Scholarship Awards

This year it was decided to award scholarships to two very deserving students.

The first was awarded to Benjamin Graham, who's leadership in school activities, membership in track and baseball teams and outstanding academic record made him an easy winner.

The second was awarded to Sarah Ball, whose school activities are abundant: she is academically excellent, is involved in South High clubs, student council, honor service groups, and is a talented singer and dancer. She also is a community helpline volunteer and youth band member.



In accordance with our bylaws, Board of Director elections will be held at the May 24th general meeting. We encourage members to consider running for office.
