### Underground Utilities Committee (UUC)

The Underground Utilities Committee has completed its survey to identify residents who are interested in moving utility lines underground.

As a result of the nearly 2000 surveys sent

out by the committee, the city has chosen one district to act as a pilot for officially assessing interest in undergrounding. A district is a small subset of a survey area bound by contiguous front and back yards and bordering end streets.

The chosen district had a nearly 75% positive response rate in our survey. The city will officially survey the district and, if the survey response is greater than 50% in favor, begin moving forward with undergrounding utilities. The committee will continue to inform the RHA on progress within this district and any other which the city chooses to move forward with.

#### RHA Membership Renewal Guideline

The Riviera Homeowners Association has been working to improve the way we track and report our membership dues activities. Each newsletter has the most recent dues payment information right above your mailing address information. This has led to the need for clarification of the dues payment guidelines we follow in identifying dues as paid or unpaid.

The RHA's business year begins in September and ends in August. It was meant to track with the school calendar year. The current 2001-2002 business year began on September 1, 2001 and will end on August 31, 2002. Annual dues received during this period are to be counted towards this period. We are making an exception this business year. Those dues that have been received since June 2001 have been counted towards the 2001-2002 business year. We hope this guideline helps you to better understand the dues payment message included in each newsletter.

Also, please review the new membership enrollment form below . We have located it on the flip side of the mailing address. This was done so that when the enrollment form is cut out and sent in, the

mailing address information that is in our records is included with it.
