
Hope Witkowsky and Ted Lieu; Developer Doug Maupin; and a representative from the League of Women Voters, plus more.

project on PCH and Camino de las Colinas. The project was submitted with two significant variances for height and FAR (size). The plan was approved by the Planning Commission, however just moments before the developer, Doug Maupin was to present the plan (in response to an appeal) to the City Council, he decided to request a delay. He used that time to confer with myself and the impacted neighbors. He then presented a revised plan that complied with all height and size ordinances. It was a great example of a developer working with the neighborhood and within the framework of the City's building ordinances. I ended up speaking to the City Council in favor of the new, revised compliant project.

In line with all of the action at City Hall, the RHA board thought it would be beneficial to gather up some experts on the subject of development in our City and ask them to share their thoughts and take questions from our residents. I want to invite all Riviera residents to our first general meeting of the year, Wednesday, October 20th, 7p.m. at Richardson Middle School. We are extending invitations to developers, City Council members, City Planning Commissioners, and a representative from the League of

Women Voters. I hope you will join us. Your input is crucial. We all want our neighborhood, the Hollywood Riviera, to continue to shine...like the jewel of the South Bay.

WHAT'S UP IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

OUTSTANDING LANDSCAPE AWARDS



The Outstanding Landscape Award for May was given to the **Rognlien Family at 187 Via Los Miradores.** Their spacious corner lot is screened from the street by rows of coppery, Hopseed Bush, with a colorful border of grasses, Mexican sage, Phormium and a rose garden set off by a handsome brick walkway. Interesting note: with city permission the Rognliens re-routed their front entry and address from Calle Mayor to Via Los Miradores.



The Outstanding Landscape Award for July was presented to the **Rocchio Family at 155 Via La Circula**. Their newly remodeled ranch style home is framed by a large Brazilian Pepper tree and 3 white Birch trees, with a border of Society Garlic, Lavender, Salvia Chiapensis, and Iceberg Roses.



The Outstanding Landscape Award for June was given to **Pam and Mark Martis at 116 Via Estrellita.** Their lovely, original Spanish home and garden is framed by an aged and gnarled Nesophilia tree. Their border is filled with Pentas, Lantana, Bougainvillaea, Papyrus, Banyan shrubs, Phormium and Yarrow.




The Outstanding Landscape Award for August was presented to **Pamela and Jim Quinn at 263 Calle de Andalucia**. Their drought resistant, Mediterranean style garden is highlighted by Jerusalem Sage, Lavender, Pennisetum Rubrum, Westringia, Mexican Sage and Bougainvillaea.



The Outstanding Landscape Award for September was presented to Kathy Yandell and Fred Powell at 316 Via Colusa. This varied and colorful cottage style garden sits back from the street and high above a broad, velvety expanse of green lawn shaded by mature trees. Highlights of this lively border are Kangaroo Paws, tall Dahlias, Gloriosa Daisies, Iceberg Roses, Ivy and Cranesbill Geraniums, and huge pots of Coleus by the front door. Interspersed are a garden angel and fence fragments. Don't miss the striking wooden Harry Potter Witch on the porch beam. Kathy is the owner/operator of Inner Gardens.

RIVIERA RAINFALL 2003/4

The rainfall for the period July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004 was below normal. Last year we had 13.22 inches (Normal is about 14 inches) and this year we only had 9.53 inches. Recognizing that the rainfall is different depending on your location in the Riviera, these measurements were taken on Via Los Miradores. I calibrated the Davis Rain Collector II with help from John Sellars. Disparity of rainfall in LA was not more evident than last year, on November 12th, when some cities in the LA Basin had 7-9 inches of rain over a five-hour period. During that same day, the Riviera had 1.15 inches

The year started off fast, with three days of monsoonal rains in July and one in August. The winter rains were often but not too heavy (about 3 inches). There were 17 days of rain in the Oct-Dec timeframe. This mitigated the potential for heavy mudslides after an unforgiving fire season. It was also good for an early ski/snowboard season. There was minimal amount of

rain in January. February was the strongest month: 4.54 inches with 2.94 inches in just one day (2/25). It rained three more days in March and we have not had any rain since then. That's six months of no rain!

We had a below average rainfall for 2003/4. This year predictions show a return of an El Niño condition, which could mean a wetter winter. I hope we will have at least an average rainfall this year.

EARLY RIVIERA AIRFIELD






IMPORTANT NOTICE RE: RIVIERA ELEMENTARY

The map at right shows the recommended route for parents to use when dropping off and picking up their children at Riviera Elementary.

This flow helps ensure the smoothest flow of traffic during the very busy school start and end times, but above all, it helps insure against accidents and injuries.

In addition to the 8:30-9:00 morning drop off times, this year there is a new 'valet' pickup procedure to make the afternoon departures safer yet. This makes for longer lines of cars during a concentrated period of time between 3:00 and 3:30 pm, so the school, the PTA, and most of all the children ask for your patience and cooperation during the hectic after-school rush hour. And, as always, drive carefully and obey the speed limits at all times!
