RIVIERA RAIN REPORT by Doug Holker





Wow, what a wet year! We had the 2nd wettest recorded rain year (LA had 37.25 inches). Along with the rain, came power outages, hail, mudslides, lightening storms and flooding. From July 1, 2004 to June 30, 2005, the Riviera had 30.27 inches.

The year started off typical with no rain during the summer. That all changed the last 2 weeks of October when we had 4.21 inches and it rained 9 of the last 14 days!

November rain was below normal and by December, we had minimal rain for the first 26 days and then it poured for a monthly total of 5.33 inches.

In January it rained 8 of the first 11 days, with a total of 7.71 inches . Com-


bined with the end of December, it rained over 11 inches in 2-weeks—a record (LA had 16.97 inches).

The hardest rains came in February — 8 days with storms producing nearly 10 inches of rain.

We experienced typical months during March & April. Then finished the year with 2 minor rainy days in May.

The summer has been quite pleasant - that's one of the reasons we all live here! This coming year the Farmers Almanac shows a return to a mild, normal rain year—we will just have to wait to see what Mother Nature has in store!





UPDATE FROM TORRANCE GENERAL PLAN MEETING by Steve Gerhardt

The update of Torrance's General Plan (GP) (long-range planning document that guides land use development for the next 20 years) is proceeding through a series of public meetings before the Planning Commission (PC) with City Council adoption slated for Fall 2006.

The General Plan: 1. Establishes land use designations for private & public land, 2. Establishes policies for growth, 3. Identifies major transportation network improvements & other infrastructure priorities & 4. Enumerates other broad policies.

The City of Torrance was reviewed at several public meetings & 7 areas that need to be updated were identified - none near the Riviera. Land use options for each of these 7 areas were developed by the consultant & the planning staff & presented for consideration by the PC. The PC then re-

viewed the info presented, made adjustments & finally formed a recommendation that these land use changes be presented to City Council as part of the overall GP adoption.

Some recommended changes involved converting commercial lands to medium high residential property. In the past, similar recommended changes generated controversy when brought forward as part of development projects proposed in zones where residential uses wouldn't have been allowed without a change in zoning.

The public pointed out that a policy framework was needed for the new GP in order to make such determinations,

GENERAL PLAN PUBLIC MEETINGS

October 26 November 9 Novembe<u>r 30</u> especially given the founding principle of a balance between residential, commercial, & industrial land uses for the City of Torrance.

With important items such as the number of units & type of housing needed over the next 20 years & the conservation of industrial lands to support local businesses unresolved, members of the PC saw the disadvantage of making specific land use changes in advance of discussing the overall policy direction regarding growth and without growth projections.

The next series of meetings will detail important aspects required to enhance the quality of life for all who live, work, shop, & play in Torrance.

WANT TO SAY GOODBYE TO ALL THE WIRES & POLES IN THE RIVIERA? by Dick Rector

Recently, Dick Rector was appointed as the Chairman of the Undergrounding of Utilities Committee. This committee, was formed about 5 years ago with the goal of undergrounding all of those ugly wires & poles that distract from the beauty of our community. At that time, the area was divided into 7 areas, Area 4 was the most active getting over 35% of residents to approve the engineering study.

We are now looking for a Chairperson to head up each of the 7 areas. Hermosa

and Manhattan Beach have completed several undergrounding projects & we'd like to follow in their successful footsteps.

The estimated costs of undergrounding varies from \$10k to \$25k per lot, & depends on the improvement of your view. Payments can be spread out over the course of years through your tax bill.
