SPECIAL LANDSCAPE AWARD

Like the Lamp Post that was a major landmark in the country of Narnia (from the book by C. S. Lewis: The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe), the Hollywood Riviera Lamp Post at the five-way intersection of Via Monte d'Oro, Camino de las Colinas and Camino del Campo (just off of Palos Verdes Blvd. & Catalina Ave.), stands alone. For many years this lamp post was tended by former resident and Riviera shop owner, Morgan Moore. Without a water source, the Lamp Post has mostly shared its small space with a couple of scrawny hawthorn bushes and occasional garage sale signs. Today, it is a showpiece of bougainvillea and white flowers, mostly potted chrystanthemums. Cymbidium orchids in Spanish Moss grace the pole. The small space was uniquely orchestrated by a nearby neighbor who previously held the title of "Guerilla Gardener." Now the Riviera Homeowners Association and the Rivera Garden Club are proud to unmask the previously unknown gardener and tell all his name: Cavin Shorter. Cavin is a local resident who grew up and went to school in our area. Cavin is a property manager and is VERY community oriented. Hurray! Thank you Cavin for adding a touch of whimsy and beauty to our community! How fun it is to drive by!

The Lamp-post was a major landmark in the country of Narnia, located in the northern unpopulated area, which was named Lantern Waste after it. Resembling a London streetlamp, it stood in the middle of the forest and shone day and night. It was at the lamp-post that Lucy Pevensie first met Mr. Tumnus.

The Lamp-post originated in the first few days of Narnia's creation, from a bar of iron which Queen Jadis had torn from a London lamp-post and thrown at Aslan. Aslan at the time was creating the living things of Narnia by his song, which made the ground of Narnia magically fertile and gave birth to the animals and plants of the world. The iron bar fell to the ground and, under the influence of Aslan's song, gave birth to a new lamppost, which grew from a few feet high to a full sized streetlight in a few hours.


The Lamp-post's ability to burn continuously without fuel (London street lamps run on gas) may have been due to the fact that it is an organic living thing, not a manufactured artifact as other street lamps are.

UPDATE ON HELICOPTER NOISE

In the October issue of the Riviera Reporter there was an article asking residents if they were concerned about the amount of helicopter noise in the Riviera. Since then, about 100 people have "signed" an online petition to the Mayor and City Council of Torrance asking for their help in reducing helicopter noise. In late October, the Mayor spoke of this problem and sent letters to Robinson Helicopter Company and the Coast Guard requesting that they fly higher. There is one autobiography out about him, with another in the works. Universal pictures optioned the motion pictures rights to the story. 

Bill and Josh have lived in their contemporary/Spanish style house for two years. The newly built house came complete with a more austere type of landscaping. Since then, Bill has turned the grounds into an eclectic oasis of colorful plants, trees, and bushes highlighted by beautiful iron work at windows, door and gate. The colorful terraced hillscape is planted with roses and geraniums and dotted with a Japanese maple and palms. Their front yard terrace, which is a perfect place to watch the sunset, has had the perimeter planted with privot bushes which provide privacy from the street. The hill-side along the driveway and house has been carefully planted with a rusty colored sedum and other plantings that protect the hill. Bill grew up with his twelve brothers and sisters in the Seaside neighborhood, attending local Catholic schools. Josh is a transplant from Ohio. The neighborhood is truly enhanced by the careful attention to detail on their property.

The upper side of the steep slope on Calle Mayor cause homeowners landscape challenges, but Bejan and Hallie have done a wonderful job. Hallie has been her own designer on the six month relandscaping project that undertook boulders being brought in, new lighting, sprinkler system and the addition of drought tolerant plants. Papyrus and palms soften the edges of three different levels. Mature blue agave highlight one side of the yard. Flagstone steps and an ocean view flagstone terrace show off the contemporary, updated home. The water wise plantings and ground cover are surprisingly interspersed with white irises and colorful pansies at the lower grass level but do not detract from the overall theme. Terrific lighting make the house a treat to drive by day or night! – thanks Bejan & Hallie!.
