### The Presidents Message: **ROOFTOP DECKS AND**

TREES: I wanted to review the results from the rooftop deck meeting because apparently there has been some inaccurate information being spread. We had a great turnout at the RHA Rooftop Deck Meeting on February 25, only standing room left. At the end of the rooftop deck RHA meeting, I personally went up to Mayor Scotto with many other people listening in, and asked the Mayor what his accounting was from his raised hand poll that he took at the end of the meeting. The Mayor told me that 80% of people raised their hands to show that they wanted rooftop decks banned in the City of Torrance. In addition, the petition in favor of rooftop decks gathered 14 signatures and the petition opposed to rooftop decks gathered over 100 signatures. The anonymous




I put together all of this information and paperwork and gave it to the Mayor and Councilman Pat Furey in April 2009 and included a note to please notify me regarding when decisions or next steps that will be taken regarding this. Nothing has happened so far in regards to a decision or further step toward rooftop decks that I am aware of. Hearing about past experiences concerning other issues and how long it can take for action to occur, I believe that Torrance City Council needs to hear from you as to your percentage or accounting of the raised hand poll taken by the Mayor plus that you want this issue addressed right away and let them know if you want a ban or something else.

signed the in favor of rooftop deck petition have written letters to the Torrance City Council about the last RHA newsletter reporting the results shown on the graph of the hand count as questionable and feel that the reporting of the meeting did not provide a balanced account of the comments that were offered that evening. So I have included the above information to help with this.

We, as the Riviera Homeowners Association, are only the messengers and organizers in all of this and want to report and represent what you want. I have been involved with many Torrance residents and Torrance city officials in helping with what is important to you and them.

Please help me help you by sending a new letter now to the Planning Dept, City Council<u>and me</u> as to <u>your</u> accounting of the hand poll taken by the Mayor <u>and whether you want a ban or other regarding rooftop decks</u> or you may find that rooftop decks possibly may not be addressed in the near future.

Also, the Mayor at this same meeting asked a question and took a hand poll of residents who have issues with trees, and the results were very large, even higher than the 80% that raised their hands that wanted rooftop decks banned. Please consider writing a separate letter with your concerns regarding issues with trees to myself at president@hollywoodriviera.org or our P.O. #### CRIME in the RIVIERA

While our neighboorhood remains VERY safe there have been recent crimes of note: On the evening of May 8th, A Riviera woman assaulted by two men with a gun while she was walking (this occurred on Calle Miramar). Also, there have been MANY car break ins. DO NOT leave visible valuables in your car. Please be aware of your surroundings Lock your car and put valuables in the trunk..

We are safer if we are informed and cautious. Key recommendations from the Torrance Police Department:

- 1. When out and about don't leave your cell phone OFF at the bottom of your purse/brief case keep it ON and in a handy place such as a pocket.
- 2. If you call 911 from your cell phone it could be routed to another Police Dept. besides Torrance PD
- be sure and state that you need TPD
- 3. Keep garage doors down
- 4. Don't let any tempting items lay visible in your car (lap top, purse, cell phone, etc).
- 5. Keep your car locked and valuables in the trunk.
- 6. Call the Torrance Police immediately if you see something suspicious!
- 7. Don't let it look like it's easy to rob your house (make sure your front door has a dead bolt).
- 8. Neighborhood Watch is an important deterrent form one!

#### NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH:

Residents are complacent in the Riviera. We have VERY FEW Neighborhood Watch groups here. It is an IMPORTANT tool – informed and aware residents are a vital element against crime.
