On the topic of construction, some residents were very disappointed with the Torrance City Council's recent decision to approve the plans for the development of a Rock 'n Brews Beer Garden restaurant on the site of the former Oliver's at Palos Verdes Blvd. and PCH. Many people testi- Doors open at 6:30. Public welcome. fied at the council meeting of their concerns about noise,

traffic, parking, late hours of the restaurant, and possible loss of property value for homes near the site. Nonetheless, the council voted unanimously, with a number of conditions, to approve the construction. We are waiting to see the result. Will it become a favorite diner, or the noisy neighbor you cannot abide? Stay tuned.

Not to be forgotten in the new year is the subject of vegetation and its impact on our precious views. This will re-emerge as the prime focus of our February RHA meeting with a presentation by David Wahba, planning director and "view expert" in Rolling Hills Estates, which has a very successful tree/view ordinance. Mr. Wahba is a former Riviera resident who is very familiar with our situation in Torrance. He will explain how their ordinance came about, how residents can file a "view equity" claim, and how view disputes are resolved in RHE. We think this could be a model for us in the Riviera.

Also the same evening, on a lighter note, will be a presentation by local author Bill Sewell, author of a new novel of international espionage, "Nonofficial Asset." Mr. Sewell, is a security expert and a former contractor for the CIA, will discuss his experiences and how those contributed to his book. There will be time for questions and copies of his book will be available for sale and for him to sign.

The planting includes: Salvia, cosmos, multiple rose bushes, agapanthus, foxglove, stock, day lily, black-eyed susan, zinnia, pansy, papyrus, and impatiens.

# Mike Johnson and Thai Ha 437 Via El Chico Redondo Beach, CA 90277

On a street less travelled, an artful expression of unity weaves through this garden. The larger, uphill share of the garden is defined by a low stone-faced wall interspersed with large Asian ceramic pots. The garden plane - meticulously covered with multicolored pebbles sets the artworks' stage. A Japanese maple punctuates the entry to the garden and a curved, stone path leads you through a display of three large bronze sculptures. Each sculpture sup-



ports a unique representation of unity and co-existence. The largest sculpture "Where Cultures Meet" by Benjamin Victor is also installed, in an even larger scale, on the campus of CSU Dominquez Hills. (http://www.csudh.edu/communityandfriends/pictureart.shtml) This water-wise, uphill portion of the garden is offset with a calming rock waterfall and pond on the downhill share of the garden. (Some rocks were transplanted from Vietnam) This space is planted with another Japanese maple plus low-lying juniper, convolvulus and red apple ground covers. The garden is tied together by the use of minimal planting, assorted rocks, juxtaposed wet and dry landscape, and deeply expressive artwork. The landscape was designed by the homeowners and installed with assistance from Paradise Landscape.
