RIVIERANS FAVOR BUSSING

A while back, officials of the Torrance City Bus Lines asked our president, James "Scotty" Finlay to make a survey amongst the people who live in the Riviera hill streets, to see if they really wanted bus service south of Calle Mayor. "Scotty" received such a good response that the people wanted the bus that the city has decided to continue the service. The people want bussing up to Arboles.

It is surprising the number of Rivierans who do not realize that this bus line exists. One Eastern couple who spend practically every winter out here, visiting their daughter, told me that they use the buses at least three times a week and it gives them a certain amount of independence they love. The bus starts at the corner of Calle de Arboles and Via Colusa, turns off Colusa at Calle Miramar and goes to Calle Mayor and turns right to Pacific Coast Highway. (Pacific Plaza Shopping Center) It then proceeds past South High and on to Hawthorne, where it turns north to the Del Amo Shopping center and the Financial Center. It then proceeds to downtown Torrance where a tranfer can be made to Los Angeles. The Torrance bus line also stops at El Camino College.

On its reverse trip the bus leaves downtown Torrance to Del Amo, the Pacific Coast Highway, to Calle Mayor, west to Monte De Oro, up to Calle De Arboles and to its starting point at Via Colusa. The Torrance bus drivers wish you would relax in their busses and leave the driving to them. At least you'll see more.

The two Palos Verdians who had asked to be allowed to appear and ask for the barriers removal did not put in an apperance and from the attitude of the Rivierans who live near the barriers, it was just as well.

NOTES FROM THE ART JURY AND COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

Most new residents in the Hollywood Riviera section do not realize that there are elaborate deed restrictions on their property, placed there by the original developers in 1927 and 1928, in order to protect all of the Hollywood Riviera property owners from undesirable developments. These deed restrictions create the Hollywood Riviera Community Association, to which all property owners in the Hollywood Riviera section automatically belong by virtue of their ownership. There is a Board of Directors that governs the Community Association.

Under the deed restrictions, all remodeling or new building plans must be approved by the Art Jury (actually an architectural control committee).

New procedures are in the process of being installed by the Art Jury in which the Torrance Building Department will notify anyone from the Hollywood Riviera area when applying for a building permit, that their plans must be submitted to the Art Jury, through its Chairman, Stanley Dunn at 505 Via La Selva.

We hope to put in a continuing series of articles in this newsletter dealing with the history and policies of the Community Association so that everyone will be better informed as to its existence and operations.
