From County Assessor Philip E. Watson comes the warning that a person claiming to be a deputy county assessor has been contacting residents in the South Bay and West Los Angeles areas to appraise household furnishings, check valuable papers and to inquire about their homeowner's exemption. According to Watson, "household furnishings and other valuables in a private residence have been exempt from property taxation since 1966, and anyone who seeks to gain access to the property for this purpose is a fraud."

If you are contacted about such a matter, do not allow the person to enter your premises and promptly call the Torrance Police.

MORE AIRPORT "DID YOU KNOWS"

Did you know that:

- --On a recent Saturday flights from Torrance Airport were timed `at every 45 seconds?
- -- The Master Plan provides for 1,061 aircraft parking spaces?
- -- The above figure does not allow for itinerant operations?
- --As airport traffic increases the flight area spreads out to cover more and more of Torrance?
- -- In Europe major <u>commercial</u> airports are completely shut down to all traffic after 10:00 p.m.?
- -- A California Noise Equivalent Level of 65 decibels is presently applied to L.A. International, Long Beach and Torrance airports?

The Riviera Homeowners Association has taken a position which includes opposition to airport expansion and navigational aids which would increase traffic. The association asserts that the noise problem needs to be settled and flight patterns should be enforced. We have also called for a homeowners' representative on the Airport Commission.
