The primary topic will focus on Torrance Transit Services, which offers much more than a traditional bus system. Transit Planning Manager David Mach will be on hand to explain the wide range of services and how to use them, including:

- The many bus routes and services to local venues including SoFi Stadium and Hollywood Bowl
- Connect Torrance Microtransit Program which offers inexpensive rides within Torrance. There are two zones: one for all residents and one for people 65+ or with disabilities

Imants and Cristina found that lavender, rosemary, and varieties of sage and succulents seem to thrive. They used stones and pavers to eliminate the lawn and add usable seating and relaxing areas. Imants built the fence along the side of the house and did all the hard labor himself!

The RHA is Turning 80!

In December the Riviera Homeowners Association will celebrate the 80th anniversary of our first meeting. Here are some fun historical facts about the Hollywood Riviera:

- While the Hollywood Riviera Homeowners Association held our first meeting in December of 1945 and
 focused on advocating for residents of the Riviera, the Hollywood Riviera Community Association, led
 by developer Clifford Reid, had been operating since 1927 as the agency overseeing the development and
 sale of lots in the Riviera. Reid led the Community Association until he retired as the group's president in
 1950.
- In 1927 the city of Torrance, seeking to include a recreational beach for the enjoyment of city residents, annexed most of the area of the Riviera being developed by Reid, designating a portion of Redondo Beach to the city of Torrance.
- Reid sought to promote the Hollywood Riviera as a resort-style living destination for the Hollywood-based film industry. While a few Hollywood stars such as Gary Cooper, Ethel Barrymore and Clark Gable visited the Riviera, it was Rosemary DeCamp, popular radio, film and television actress, who made her home in the Hollywood Riviera. Located at 317 Camino de las Colinas, the beautiful Spanish revival style home was built by Reid in 1930 as one of the first homes established in the newly Torrance-annexed area of Redondo Beach.

Ask the RHA

Dear RHA,

Do you have advice on who to contact about removing dead trees that are below our property on city land? I did email the public works department about it and am waiting to hear back.

- New to the Riviera

Dear New:

You've already done the right thing by contacting the city's Public Works Department about the dead trees. If you did it by phone, it's sometimes helpful to follow up with an email that contains pictures. When we had an online meeting about wildfire safety in April, Daniel Singleton, of the Public Affairs branch of the Torrance Fire Department, addressed resident concerns about how Torrance had not cleared vegetation on the hill below your property in more than a decade. He assured us that they were going to clear it, and you probably saw the goats in June. It might be worth emailing him (or copying him on your email to Public Works), about how, even with the grasses now goat-trimmed, there are still dead trees on the hillside serving as potential wildfire fuel.
